# Declare You Care March Challenge

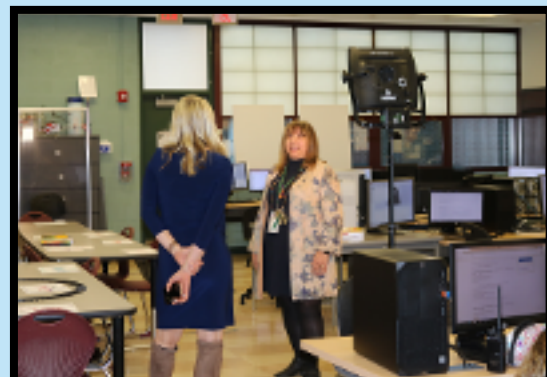

# How Do We Recognize Students?

Students displaying exemplary behaviors will receive a "Condor ticket" or a Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) starfish from any of our staff members. If a student receives a "Condor buck", they will pick a number from 1 to 100. The student's name will be placed on the 100's board with that corresponding number. The student's name and reason for the acknowledgement will be read over the morning announcements and the the ticket will be displayed. Once we have completed a row of 10 numbers across, up, down, or diagonally, each student will receive an award. Those students receiving a RAK will be recognized during morning announcements and the Starfish will be displayed as well.
