For the first time, all members of the sophomore IT shop have passed the Microsoft Word Certification Exam. All 17 members were awarded this industry entry level credential. Congratulations!

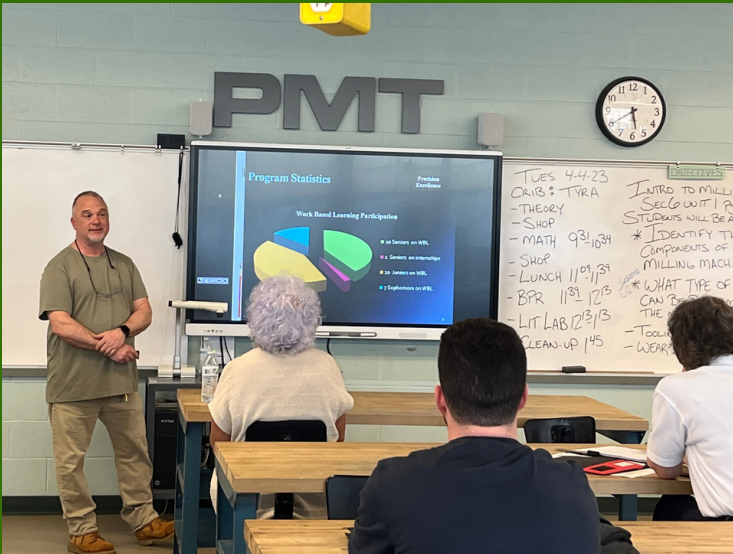




PMT HOSTS INDUSTRY PARTNERS

SENIORS VISIT FINANCIAL REALITY FAIR

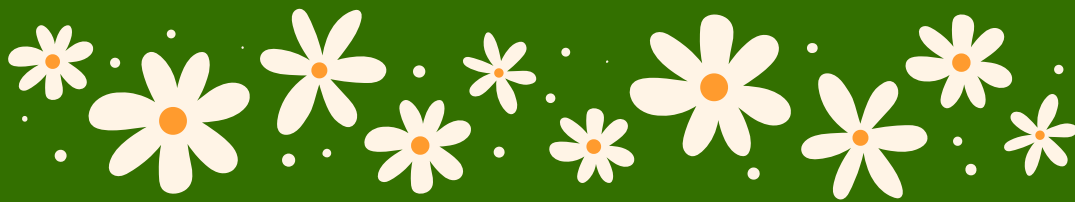
A group of Economics students attended the Financial Reality Fair at Lewis Mills High School, which is sponsored annually by the Credit Union League of CT & CT Credit Unions.

In this hands-on learning exercise, students choose a career in which they are interested, and are given worksheets that discuss such topics as expected salaries, the housing market, credit and more. They visit booths manned by Chamber volunteers, decide how as working adults they would spend money on such things as transportation, food, clothing, entertainment and more, then meet with financial advisors who review their spending choices and discuss how they could have made better selections.
